





DRAFT EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT LEGISLATIVE RESOLUTION

on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down the legal framework of the European Solidarity Corps and amending Regulations (EU) No 1288/2013, (EU) No 1293/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1305/2013, (EU) No 1306/2013 and Decision No 1313/2013/EU (COM(2017)0262 – C8-0162/2017 – 2017/0102(COD))

(Ordinary legislative procedure: first reading)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission proposal to Parliament and the Council (COM(2017)0262),
- having regard to Article 294(2) and Articles 165(4) and 166(4) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, pursuant to which the Commission submitted the proposal to Parliament (C8-0162/2017),
- having regard to Article 294(3) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,
- having regard to its resolution on the European Solidarity Corps of 6 April 2017, No. 2017/2585(RSP)¹,
- having regard to the reasoned opinions submitted, within the framework of Protocol No
 2 on the application of the principles of subsidiarity and proportionality, by the Czech
 Senate, the Spanish Parliament and the Portuguese Parliament, asserting that the draft
 legislative act does not comply with the principle of subsidiarity,
- having regard to the opinion of the European Economic and Social Committee of 19 October 2017²,
- having regard to the opinion of the Committee of the Regions of...³,
- having regard to the European Year of Volunteering 2011 Policy Agenda for Volunteering in Europe (PAVE) document and the related EYV2011 5 year review from 2015, "Helping Hands";
- having regard to Rule 59 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Culture and Education and the opinions of the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs, the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety, the Committee on Budgets, the Committee on Regional Development and the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (A8-0060/2018),



- 1. Adopts its position at first reading hereinafter set out;
- 2. Calls on the Commission to refer the matter to Parliament again if it replaces, substantially amends or intends to substantially amend its proposal;
- 3. Instructs its President to forward its position to the Council, the Commission and the national parliaments.

Text proposed by the Commission

(1) The European Union is built on solidarity, among its citizens and among its Member States. This common value guides its actions and provides the necessary unity to cope with current and future societal challenges, which young Europeans are willing to help address by expressing their solidarity in practice.

(1) Solidarity, among Union citizens and among EU Member States, is one of the universal values on which the European Union is built. This common value guides its actions, provides the necessary unity to cope with current and future societal challenges, which young Europeans are willing to help address by

expressing their solidarity in practice, and stimulates young people's interest in the common European project. The principle of solidarity is enshrined in Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union and in the preamble of the Charter on Fundamental Rights of the European Union.

(2) The State of the Union address of 14 September 2016 *emphasized* the need to invest in young people and announced the establishment of a European Solidarity Corps with a view to creating opportunities for young people across the Union to make a meaningful contribution to society, show solidarity and develop their skills, thus *getting* not only work but also invaluable human experience.

(3) In its Communication "A European Solidarity Corps" of 7 December 2016¹⁸, the Commission emphasised the need to strengthen the foundations for solidarity work across Europe, to provide young people with more and better opportunities for solidarity activities covering a broad range of areas, and to support national and local actors, in their efforts to cope with different challenges and crises. The Communication launched a first phase of the European Solidarity Corps whereby different Union programmes have been mobilised to offer volunteering, traineeship or job opportunities to young people across the EU. These activities, whether implemented before or after the entry into force of this Regulation, should continue to apply the rules and conditions set by the respective Union programmes that have financed them under the first phase of the European Solidarity Corps.


Proposal for a regulation Recital 4

Text proposed by the Commission

(4) Young people should be provided with easily accessible opportunities to engage in solidarity activities, which could enable them to express their commitment to the benefit of communities while acquiring useful experience, skills and competences for their personal, educational, social, civic and professional development, thereby improving their employability. Those activities would also support the mobility of young volunteers, trainees and workers.

Amendment

(4) Young people should be provided with easily accessible opportunities to engage in high quality solidarity activities, which would bring positively affect society while also enabling them to express their commitment in solidarity with, and to the benefit of, *local* communities and to enhance social cohesion, while acquiring useful experience, knowledge skills and competences for, first and foremost, their personal development, thus boosting their self-esteem, autonomy and motivation to learn, as well as stimulating their educational, social, artistic, linguistic, cultural, civic and professional development. Those activities would also support the mobility of young volunteers, trainees or employees in accordance with national labour mobility law.

Text proposed by the Commission

Amendment

(4a) Special attention should be paid to multilingualism because some of the solidarity placements will be cross-border in nature.

Amendment 10

Proposal for a regulation Recital 5

Text proposed by the Commission

(5) The solidarity activities offered to young people should be of high quality, in the sense that they should *respond to unmet* societal needs, contribute to strengthening communities, offer young people the opportunity to acquire valuable knowledge and competences, be financially *acceessible* to young people, and be implemented in safe and healthy conditions.

Amendment

The solidarity activities offered to young people should be of high quality, in the sense that they should help to overcome significant, clearly identified societal challenges and respond to significant, clearly identified needs and contribute to strengthening local or national communities and social cohesion and to enhancing active citizenship. Solidarity activities should respond to personal needs and contribute to the professional development of participants, offer young people the opportunity to acquire valuable knowledge, skills and competences, be financially sustainable and *effectively accessible* to young people, and be implemented in safe and healthy conditions. Solidarity activities should guarantee a geographical balance and the effective inclusion of, and accessibility for, in particular, disadvantaged young people. Solidarity activities should never replace corporate social responsibility policies or have a negative impact on existing jobs or traineeships.

Text proposed by the Commission

(5a) The ESVS should provide young people with an opportunity to gain invaluable experience, develop their skills and contribute to society, involving more and better opportunities covering a broad range of activities, while at the same time providing access to proper training, followed by formal recognition of the skills and experience gained.

Proposal for a regulation Recital 6

Text proposed by the Commission

(6) The European Solidarity *Corps* would provide a *single* entry point for solidarity activities throughout the Union. Consistency and complementarity of that framework should be ensured with other relevant Union policies and programmes. The European Solidarity *Corps* should build on the strengths and synergies of existing programmes, notably the European Voluntary Service. It should also complement the efforts made by Member States to support young people and ease their school-to-work transition under the Youth Guarantee¹⁹ by providing them with additional opportunities to make a start on the labour market in the form of traineeships or jobs in solidarity-related areas within their respective Member State or across borders. Complementarity with existing Union level networks pertinent to the activities under the European Solidarity Corps, such as the European Network of Public Employment

(6) The *ESVS* would provide a *main* entry point for solidarity activities throughout the Union. Consistency and complementarity of that framework should be ensured with other relevant Union policies and programmes and should not jeopardise the financing of the existing relevant programmes in the area of solidarity. The ESVS should build on the strengths and synergies of existing programmes, notably the European Voluntary Service and Youth in Action. Furthermore, complementarity between existing related schemes and the ESVS should be ensured, in particular with solidarity, volunteering, civil service and mobility schemes for young people operating at national, regional or local level. It should be ensured that the ESVS remains free from discrimination based on gender, social or economic considerations, and it should build on good practices where appropriate. The

Services, EURES and the Eurodesk network, should also be ensured.
Furthermore, complementarity between existing related schemes, in particular national solidarity schemes and mobility schemes for young people, and the European Solidarity Corps should be ensured, building on good practices where appropriate.

ESVS should not substitute national schemes. Access for all young people to national solidarity activities should be guaranteed in all Member States by means of adequate legal frameworks and national resources. Partnerships with European networks which are specialised in certain urgent social problems which are insufficiently tackled by Member States such as extreme poverty, homelesness, destitution among minorities, such as Roma Communities and the exclusion of asylum seekers, should be established.

Europe for Citizens programme, the European Regional Development Fund and the Health Programme to contribute to the objectives of the *European Solidarity Corps* by supporting activities within its scope. This contribution should be financed in accordance with the respective basic acts of the *concerned programmes*. Once they have obtained a valid *European Solidarity Corps* quality label, the *beneficiaries* should be given access to the *European Solidarity Corps* portal and receive the quality and support measures provided according to the type of activity offered.

European Regional Development Fund and the Health Programme to contribute to the objectives of the ESVS by supporting activities within its scope. This contribution should be financed in accordance with the respective basic acts of the programmes concerned with a view to securing greater involvement of young people, civil society, and existing volunteering schemes in Member States. Once they have obtained a valid *ESVS* quality label, the *participating* organisations should be given access to the *ESVS* portal and receive the quality and support measures provided according to the type of activity offered.

Proposal for a regulation Recital 8

Text proposed by the Commission

(8) The European Solidarity Corps should open up new opportunities for young people to carry out volunteering, traineeship or job placements in solidarityrelated areas as well as to devise and develop solidarity projects based on their own initiative. Those opportunities should contribute to enhancing *their* personal, educational, social, civic and professional development. The *European Solidarity* Corps should also support networking activities for European Solidarity Corps participants and organisations as well as measures to ensure the quality of the supported activities and to enhance the validation of their learning outcomes.

Amendment

(8) The **ESVS** should open up new opportunities for young people to carry out volunteering, traineeship or job placements in solidarity-related areas as well as to devise and develop solidarity projects based on their own initiative. Those opportunities should help respond to unmet societal needs and contribute to strengthening communities and should contribute to enhancing the personal, educational, social, civic and professional development of young people. The ESVS should also support networking activities for *ESVS* participants and organisations as well as measures to ensure the quality of the supported activities and to enhance the validation of their learning outcomes. It should also contribute to supporting and strengthening existing organisations implementing solidarity actions.

Proposal for a regulation Recital 9

Text proposed by the Commission

(9) Voluntary activities constitute a rich experience in a non-formal and informal learning context which enhances young people's personal, socio-educational and *development*, active citizenship and employability. Voluntary activities should *not* have an adverse effect on potential or existing paid employment, nor should they be seen as a substitute for it. *In order to* ensure continuity with respect to the volunteering activities that are supported at Union level, the volunteering activities under the European Voluntary Service that fall within the geographical scope of the European Solidarity Corps should be supported by the latter in the form of cross-border volunteering placements. The other volunteering activities under the European Voluntary Service that do not fall under the geographical scope of the European Solidarity Corps should continue to be supported under the Programme established by Regulation (EU) No 1288/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing 'Erasmus+': the Union programme for education, training, youth and sport²⁰. With respect to the interpretation of related legislation at Union level, both the cross-border volunteering placements under the European Solidarity Corps and the volunteering activities that continue to be supported under Regulation (EU) No 1288/2013 should be considered equivalent to those carried out under the European Voluntary Service.

Amendment

(9) Voluntary activities constitute a rich experience in a *formal and* non-formal learning context which enhances young people's personal, socio-educational development and active citizenship. However, given the cross-sectoral nature of solidarity-related activities, the different status of non-profit entities and organisations potentially involved into those activities, and the socio-economic significance of the solidarity sector in the Union, provisions should be included in this Regulation to ensure that voluntary activities do not have an adverse effect on potential or existing paid employment, and solidarity activities should not be seen or effectively deployed as a substitute for it. For that reason, solidarity placements in the form of volunteering should be exclusively offered by participating organisations that operate from the nonprofit sector, foundations and social enterprises.

Amendment 17

Proposal for a regulation Recital 10

Text proposed by the Commission

Traineeships and jobs in solidarity-(10)related areas can offer additional opportunities for young people to make a start on the labour market while contributing to addressing key societal challenges. This can help foster the employability and productivity of young people while easing their transition from education to employment, which is key to enhancing their chances on the labour market. The traineeship placements offered under the European Solidarity Corps should be remunerated by the participating organisation and follow the quality principles outlined in the Council Recommendation on establishing a Quality Framework for Traineeships of 10 March 2014²¹. *The traineeships and jobs* offered should constitute a stepping stone for young people to enter the labour market and should therefore be accompanied by adequate post-placement support. The traineeship and job placements should be facilitated by relevant labour market actors, in particular public and private employment services, social partners and Chambers of Commerce. As participating organisations, they should be able to apply for funding via the competent implementing structure of the *European* Solidarity Corps in view of intermediating between the young participants and employers offering traineeship and job placements in solidarity sectors.

Amendment

The ESVS should also provide for (10)a framework for traineeships and jobs in solidarity-related areas to help build social, economic and civic cohesion. Traineeships and jobs should be clearly separate from voluntary activities, both from a financial and organisational point of view, as they can offer different and additional opportunities for young people to make a start and can increase their chances on the labour market and career *prospects* while contributing to addressing key societal challenges. Traineeships and jobs should never lead to job substitution. Remunerated traineeships and jobs, however, can represent an incentive for disadvantaged young people and those with fewer opportunities to participate in solidarity-related activities that they might not otherwise be able to access. Traineeship placements can ease the transition of young people from education to employment, which is key to achieving their sustainable integration into the labour market. The traineeship placements offered under the ESVS should always be remunerated by the participating organisation and should follow the quality principles outlined in the Council Recommendation on establishing a Quality Framework for Traineeships of 10 March 2014²¹. Traineeship placements should, moreover, be distinguished from voluntary work and based on a written agreement concluded at the beginning of the traineeship between the trainee and

the participating organisation. Such written agreements should indicate the educational and training objectives, the working conditions and the duration of the traineeship, the remuneration of the trainee and the rights and obligations of the parties under the applicable national law, applicable collective agreements, or both, of the country in which the traineeship takes place. Traineeship placements offered should constitute a stepping stone for young people to enter the labour market and should not substitute jobs. Traineeship placements should be temporary and should have a reasonable duration as defined in this Regulation. Job placements should be based on a written contract and should respect all the terms and conditions of employment as defined in national law or applicable collective agreements, or both, of the country in which the job is carried out. Financial support to participating organisations offering job placements should not exceed twelve months. Traineeships and jobs should be clearly distinguished, in terms of funding and substance, from voluntary activities, and should therefore be accompanied by adequate preparation, on-the-job training and post-placement support in relation to the participation of the participant in the **ESVS** The traineeship and job placements should be facilitated by relevant labour market actors, in particular public and private employment services, social partners and Chambers of Commerce. As participating organisations, they should be able to apply for funding via the competent implementing structure of the ESVS in view of intermediating between the young participants and employers offering traineeship and job placements in solidarity sectors.

Proposal for a regulation Recital 11

Text proposed by the Commission

Young people's spirit of initiative is an important asset for society and for the labour market. The European Solidarity Corps should contribute to fostering this aspect by offering young people the opportunity to devise and implement their own projects aimed at addressing specific challenges to the benefit of their local communities. Those projects should be an opportunity to try out ideas and support young people to be themselves drivers of solidarity actions. They could also serve as a springboard for further engagement in solidarity activities and could be a first step towards encouraging European Solidarity Corps participants to engage in selfemployment or setting up associations, NGOs or other bodies active in the solidarity, non-profit and youth sectors.

Amendment

Young people's spirit of initiative is an important asset for society. The ESVS should contribute to fostering this aspect by offering young people the opportunity to devise and implement their own projects aimed at addressing specific challenges in solidarity with, and to the benefit of, local communities, particularly communities located in rural, isolated or marginalised areas. Those projects should be an opportunity for young people to develop innovative solutions and to try out ideas in a sustainable way and to experience being the drivers of solidarity actions. They could also serve as a springboard for further engagement in solidarity activities and could be a first step towards encouraging ESVS participants to engage in social entrepreneurship or as volunteers in associations, NGOs, youth organisations or other bodies active in the solidarity, non-profit and youth sectors and the setting up of their own associations. Necessary support should be given to young people and youth and student organisations in order to ensure that they can effectively develop the solidarity activities. Post-placement support could include support and advice to participants interested in setting-up and piloting associations, cooperatives, social enterprises, youth organisations and community-centres.

Text proposed by the Commission

(12)Young people and organisations participating in the European Solidarity Corps should feel that they belong to a community of individuals and entities committed to enhancing solidarity across Europe. At the same time, participating organisations need support to strengthen their capacities to offer good quality placements to an increasing number of participants. The European Solidarity **Corps** should support networking activities aimed at strengthening young people and participating organisations' engagement in this community, at fostering a European Solidarity Corps spirit, as well as at encouraging the exchange of useful practices and experience. Those activities should also contribute to raising awareness about the European Solidarity Corps among public and private actors as well as to collect feedback from participants and participating organisations on the implementation of the European Solidarity Corps.

Text proposed by the Commission

(13) Particular attention should be paid to ensuring the quality of the placements and other opportunities offered under the *European Solidarity Corps*, in particular by offering training, language support, insurance, administrative and postplacement support to participants as well as the validation of the knowledge, skills and competences acquired through their *European Solidarity Corps* experience.

Amendment

(12)Young people and organisations participating in *the ESVS* should feel that they belong to a community of individuals and entities committed to enhancing solidarity across Europe and beyond. At the same time, participating *non-profit* organisations of a general interest character or with a social aim need support to strengthen their capacities to offer good quality placements to an increasing number of participants. EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The European Solidarity Corps (ESC) is a valuable Commission initiative aimed at boosting solidarity in Europe. There is a greater need than ever for this: continuing youth unemployment, currency crises and increasing Euroscepticism mean that more commitment and solidarity are required at European level. In order to address these challenges in a long-term way and promote solidarity as early as possible, the ESC is focusing on the future of Europe: young people. The Commission's proposed programme comprises an extended European Volunteer Service and an employment strand covering jobs and practical training for the solidarity sector.

As rapporteur I am in favour of reduce the employment part of the programme from the proposed 20% to 5% of the total allocation of the Programme, in order to ensure the success of the ESC, avoid a deterioration in quality of the posts and reinforce the value of the volunteer service as a whole. Since the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs (EMPL) has exclusive responsibility for amending the paragraphs concerning the employment strand, I look forward to constructive cooperation on this with EMPL members.

I have decided to highlight the concept of solidarity in the programme. The ESC should not be a programme which primarily promotes employment, and it certainly should not be a response to youth unemployment. These issues are addressed by existing initiatives such as the *Youth Guarantee* and the *Youth Employment Initiative*, which were set up precisely with this in mind. These initiatives need to be expanded, and not devalued by the introduction of a new programme.

In addition, the broader question arises of whether working in a profit-oriented company is compatible with the concept of solidarity. The wording of the Commission proposal regarding quality control and follow-up is kept very vague, and this results in dangerous gaps in the area of employment, which will have a negative impact on those taking part.

My report focuses on promoting solidarity among young people as successfully as possible. To this end, the inclusion of disadvantaged young people must be a primary aim. The way to reach this target group is not by way of online portals but through direct contact with individuals. This requires the active involvement of the actors and organisations which organise the volunteer services. The target group can be reached only by building relationships on a personal level. For this reason I call for the targeted promotion of follow-up structures and flexibly-aligned operational bodies which will enable disadvantaged young people to experience volunteer activities. In this context I also support making volunteer services more flexible so that alternative ways of life will be compatible with the ESC and new target groups for the programme can be reached.

In this context I propose changing the name of the European Solidary Corps" to "European Solidarity and Voluntary Service", to maintain the focus on 'solidarity' but eliminate misunderstandings and the negative association of the military-sounding 'corps'.

SHORT JUSTIFICATION

The European Commission announced the European Solidarity Corps Initiative in December 2016, following President Junker's speech on the State of the Union. The overarching objective is both to encourage a sense of belonging to the European project by fostering one of its most basic values, solidarity, and to help young Europeans improve their job prospects, given the persistent coexistence of high levels of youth unemployment and skills mismatch. After being already kicked off in its "first phase", the Commission considered appropriate to propose an *ad hoc* legal framework, publishing on 30 May 2017 the proposal for a Regulation which is under scrutiny in Parliament and Council. The Regulation sets the legal basis for the Solidarity Corps, defining the budgetary and implementation arrangements for the initiative, as well as setting specific objectives and defining key terms.

The Employment and Social Affairs Committee has been tasked to produce an Opinion on the aspects of the proposal concerning specifically the so-called "occupational strand", in particular on the definitions of "traineeship" and "job" included in the text. The Employment and Social Affairs Committee has exclusive competences on these parts of the Commission proposal under Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure of the European Parliament.

Your EMPL rapporteur, broadly speaking, welcomes the Commission proposal, however he clearly signals, and addresses with his amendments, critical elements in its design. His primary objective is to ensure that the European Solidarity Corps do not open the doors to a possible distortion whereby volunteers are used to carry out tasks which should be performed under regular gainful employment. In this sense, any risk of substitution in the legislation must be dispelled. For this reason, he considers necessary to clearly separate volunteering from traineeships and jobs, also with regard to the funding allocated to both strands. Reference to employment safeguards within the text must be strengthened and the necessity for jobs and traineeships to fully respect national applicable legislation, to be obligatorily remunerated and

to be of the highest quality needs to be explicitly mentioned.

The rapporteur also believes that in order to avoid abuses in this field, it is imperative to confine the access to volunteering only to public authorities or the participating organisations in the non-profit sector. This would for example exclude the possibility, currently foreseen in the European Voluntary Service, for big companies or corporations to take up EU funded volunteers, which not only appears disputable from an ethical and financial viewpoint, but could also be turned into an unacceptable form of corporate advertising. Besides, the solidarity sector, given its cross-sectorial nature, as well as its socio-economic significance, needs to be treated with particular attention by regulators, in order to avoid any potential disruptive effect in the labour market.

Instead, for-profit companies should be allowed to take part to the ESC, only insofar they offer a remunerated job or traineeship to young people. A possible alternative option to this approach, which still needs to be explored, could be that if companies or social enterprises actors wish to get involved with the ESC initiative, they should develop partnerships or fund placements in not-for-profit entities expert in the relevant solidarity field.

The European Solidarity Corps, with the proposed adjustments, will offer new opportunities to young people in Europe to engage in solidarity activities and gain meaningful experience on the ground.

Your rapporteur would kindly ask to the Members of the Employment Committee to focus their work on the parts of the text that have a clear relevance for the activities of the EMPL Committee. This would be functional to facilitate the rapid adoption of EMPL position and would be a sign of positive and loyal cooperation with the Culture and Education Committee and the work of its Rapporteur.

These activities, whether implemented before or after the entry into force of this Regulation, should continue to apply the rules and conditions set by the respective Union programmes that have financed them under the first phase of the European Solidarity Corps.

Complementarity with existing Union level networks pertinent to the activities under the European Solidarity Corps, such as the European Network of Public Employment Services, EURES and the Eurodesk network, the European Youth Forum (YFJ), the European Volunteer Centre (CEV) and other relevant civil society organisations including the social partners, should also be ensured. Partnerships with European networks which are specialised in certain urgent social problems which are insufficiently

transition of young people from education to employment, which is key to achieving their sustainable integration into the labour market. The traineeship placements offered under the European Solidarity Corps should *always* be remunerated by the participating organisation and should follow the quality principles outlined in the Council Recommendation on establishing a Quality Framework for Traineeships of 10 March 2014²¹. *The traineeship placements* should, moreover, be distinguished from voluntary work and based on a written agreement concluded at the beginning of the traineeship between the trainee and the participating organisation. participating organisations comply with the ex-ante conditionality on social inclusion and particularly with its investment priority on the transition from institutional to community-based health and social services set out in the Common Provisions Regulation on the European Structural and Investment Funds, to prevent that EU funding can be used to support (even in an indirect way) segregating health and social infrastructures.

Justification

Since 2013, the European Union has steadily moved towards the deinstitutionalisation of health services, meaning the process replacing long-stay psychiatric hospitals with less isolated community mental health services, with the inclusion of an ex-ante conditionality in the European Structural and Investment Fund, according to which these funds cannot be dedicated to institutional health services. The European Solidarity Corps should include provisions in this sense.





on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down the legal framework of the European Solidarity Corps and amending Regulations (EU) No 1288/2013, (EU) No 1293/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1305/2013, (EU) No 1306/2013 and Decision No 1313/2013/EU (COM(2017)0262 – C8-0162/2017 – 2017/0102(COD))

SHORT JUSTIFICATION

The Commission proposal seeks to lay down a legal framework for the European Solidarity Corps (ESC) by amending Regulations (EU) No 1288/2013, (EU) No 1293/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1305/2013, (EU) No 1305/2013, and (EU) No 1306/2013, and Decision No 1313/2013/EU; the future solidarity corps is also to encompass the pre-existing European Voluntary Service (EVS). One point to note is that the European Solidarity Corps and the European Voluntary Service are not placed within the same sphere of responsibility, given that the EVS has implemented volunteering programmes in countries outside the EU. The rapporteur therefore considers it important to ensure that activities carried out under the earlier programme are not jettisoned when the two programmes are merged.

Under the European Solidarity Corps programme, 100 000 young people aged from 18 to 30 are to be mobilised by 2020 through projects focusing on conservation and environmental protection or on social cohesion. The Commission proposal is based on the philosophy of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights¹. The countries that will have access to the programme will be EU Member States and possibly other countries under bilateral agreements, but it should be borne in mind that people are now passing through the EU without a passport of any Member State. That is why the programme needs to include young people even when they do not hold an identity card issued by a Member State, and it should be made easier for them to obtain residence permits and visas.

Solidarity is one of the principles on which the EU is founded; it defines the European project

and provides the unity necessary to cope with emergencies and current and future crises. When they celebrated the 60th anniversary of the Treaties of Rome, the European Council, Parliament, and the Commission reaffirmed their commitment to enhancing solidarity, which seeks to promote the overall development of the human sphere¹.

The rapporteur thinks it vital that young people, who are being harder hit by the economic crisis and hence are more vulnerable, should be encouraged and helped to engage in every type of measure aimed at improving systems and policies within a context of solidarity, since that helps to strengthen the culture of human rights on which the EU is built.

It is important to stress that the rights of women, LGBTQI people, and migrants are human rights and that, as these groups are particularly vulnerable, a gender perspective and a migration perspective need to be incorporated into the programme guidelines.

The Commission is to be applauded for making special provision for disadvantaged young people as regards access to the voluntary training programme, which must not, under any circumstances, replace paid work or those traineeships which are regulated by the relevant local laws and intended to lead to employment contracts. The Commission and the Member States should therefore be called upon to exercise oversight in order to rule out such cases.

The rapporteur finds it worrying that resources already earmarked or committed in the education and culture sectors - Erasmus+, for example - are being transferred to the newly established European Solidarity Corps programme: Erasmust+ has proved to be one of the best means of cementing a European consciousness. Experience acquired through Erasmus+ is culturally and educationally valuable, and that fact could also be turned to account in order to guarantee a high standard of training under the European Solidarity Corps programme.

The rapporteur believes, in addition, that the social partners and all civil society stakeholders have to be involved in the process of making ex ante assessment of, and activating, supervising, and monitoring, the programme, without interfering with the voluntary civil protection networks which, whether in the field of environmental protection or because they have been involved in recovery processes in the wake of natural disasters, have contributed to, and collaborated in, Commission programmes of disaster response or environmental protection operations.



OPINION OF THE COMMITTEE ON BUDGETS

for the Committee on Culture and Education

on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down the legal framework of the European Solidarity Corps and amending Regulations (EU) No 1288/2013, (EU) No 1293/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1305/2013, (EU) No 1306/2013 and Decision No 1313/2013/EU (COM(2017)0262 – C8-0162/2017 – 2017/0102(COD))

Rapporteur: Tiemo Wölken

SHORT JUSTIFICATION

The rapporteur welcomes the proposal to set up a European Solidarity Corps (ESC) put forward by the European Commission on 30 May 2017. The EU is built on solidarity: solidarity between its citizens, solidarity across borders between its Member States, and solidarity in its actions inside and outside the Union. It is a shared value that is strongly felt within the EU. It is part of the core fabric that makes the European dream inspire generation after generation, creating common values across the Union.

The present ESC proposal provides a dedicated legal base for an initiative that gives young people across the EU the opportunity to act on their aspirations for a better Union and hence push the European project forward while developing their own skills.

However, the rapporteur is of the strong conviction that the Corps deserves its own, dedicated budget. For the period 2018-2020, the Commission proposes funding the ESC by three quarters through redeploying funds from ongoing programmes within their existing financial allocation: EUR 197,7 million is to be taken from Erasmus+ and EUR 10 million from the Employment and Social Innovation programme (EaSI), as well as EUR 47,3 million from programmes in other headings (of which EUR 35 million from the European Social Fund (ESF), EUR 6 million from the Civil Protection Mechanism, EUR 4,5 million from the LIFE programme, and EUR 1,8 million from the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD)). Only one fourth of the overall ESC envelope would be 'fresh' funding.

The rapporteur strongly rejects this set-up that funds the ESC to a large extent at the expense of key activities of other significant EU programmes, which have their own valuable missions, objectives and matching financial envelope, as budgeted for from the start of the

current MFF. What may have been acceptable in a first pilot phase of the ESC to get the activities up and running fast, cannot be a medium- or long-term solution for financing an important programme that merits not only its own legal base, but also an ambitious envelope of fresh money.

New political priorities during the current MFF require fresh resources, through the mobilisation of the flexibility provisions and special instruments included in the MFF regulation, after available margins have been exhausted. If the ESC is indeed a new priority initiative, as stated in the Joint Declaration on the EU's legislative priorities for 2017, it is only logical that it should receive fresh funding so that it may achieve its objectives without harming ongoing EU-funded programmes and projects.

The rapporteur is of the opinion that the flexibility tools provided by the current MFF, and boosted as part of the mid-term revision, such as the Flexibility Instrument and the Global Margin for Commitments, should be used to fund the ESC in the period 2018-2020. Redeployment is only acceptable where transfer of funds has been foreseen from the start of the programme, as in the case of the funding for the intra-EU activities of the European Voluntary Service under Erasmus+. By deleting the contributions of EaSI, the ESF, civil protection, LIFE and the EARD to the ESC and returning these amounts to the budget lines from which they were taken, in line with the original financial programming, the rapporteur sends a clear signal for the financing of this initiative.

LIFE, which tackles environmental and climate challenges, has delivered substantial improvements to the state of the environment in the EU. In order to continue fighting climate change and to be aligned with the Paris agreement reached during the COP21, LIFE's funding should not be redeployed for other purposes.

The EAFRD and the ESF, as part of the EU's structural and investment funds (ESIF), contribute to strengthening the economic, social and territorial cohesion of the Union. The aim of the ESIF is to reduce disparities between the development levels of the various regions. The ESC should not be financed by shifting funds away from cohesion policy.

Through the Union Civil Protection Mechanism, the Union and Member States coordinate their systems for preventing, preparing for and responding to natural and man-made disasters. Bearing in mind the significant increase of the number, severity and complexity of natural and man-made disasters in recent years, including as a result of climate change, a joint and integrated approach to disaster management is increasingly important. In this context, the rapporteur finds it unacceptable to redeploy civil protection funds for the ESC.

Further, the rapporteur proposes to strengthen the provisions regarding monitoring and evaluation of the ESC.

Finally, the rapporteur strongly encourages the Commission to prepare a clear and ambitious proposal for implementing and funding the ESC from 2021, as promised.

This Regulation lays down a (18)financial envelope of EUR 341,5 million in current prices for the period 2018-2020 which is to constitute the prime reference amount, within the meaning of Point 17 of the Interinstitutional Agreement between the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission on budgetary discipline, on cooperation in budgetary matters and on sound financial management²³, for the European Parliament and the Council during the annual budgetary procedure. The financial envelope should include the amount of EUR 197,7 million that was originally earmarked to finance the intra-Union European Voluntary Service activities under the Erasmus+ Programme for the financial years 2018, 2019 and 2020, given that those activities are to be transferred to the European Solidarity Corps Programme. Considering the need to avoid any negative impact on the financing of existing multiannual programmes, the remaining amount for the financing of the European Solidarity Corps should be drawn exclusively from unallocated margins under the multiannual financial framework ceilings.



SHORT JUSTIFICATION

Solidarity, being at the foundations of the European Union, is also one of the core values for Europeans. It is no exaggeration to say, that the success story of the European Union is based on solidarity. It has a huge potential of creating empathy, reciprocal care and positive interactions between both nations and individuals. This is why we should uphold and enforce this idea in the minds of Europeans.

Your draftsman believes that European Solidarity Corps is a great tool to achieve this goal and therefore he has very much welcomed the announcement of the idea in the State of Union address of 14 September 2016, followed by the Commission Communication "A European Solidarity Corps" of 7 December 2016 and a legislative proposal of 1 June 2017. The increased engagement of youth from all European countries in solidarity activities has a potential to strengthen solidarity and cohesion across Europe as well as to contribute to tacking societal challenges and fulfil the unmet needs in participating countries and regions. Moreover, it will support young peoples' personal and professional development through acquisition of valuable skills.

Your draftsman supports the creation of European Solidarity Corps focused on two types of actions: solidarity projects and volunteer placements on one hand, and traineeship and job placements on the other. While the first should undoubtedly be a base of the future European Solidarity Corps, the latter constitute an important chance for young people to enter the labour market and gain opportunity for quality employment. Therefore, the draftsman proposes to slightly change the indicative proportions of budget division between the two types of actions and increase the financial support for the traineeship and job opportunities to 30%.

The overall amount of EUR 341 500 000 provisioned for the implementation of the European



Solidarity Corps until 31 December 2020 will allow to mobilise 100 000 young people into solidarity activities. The draftsman supports the Commission proposal to mobilise this amount from various existing EU programmes, including i.a. EUR 35 000 000 from European Social Fund. Nevertheless, he believes the main contribution shall come from Erasmus+ programme appropriations aimed at financing European Voluntary Service (EVS) activities that would now fall under the scope of activities supported under this Regulation.

The draftsman hopes the proposal will build on the experience and best practices developed in the EVS, and will develop synergies and complementarity with other EU funds and programmes in order to fulfil its potential to the greatest possible extent.

The Committee on Regional Development considers simplification measures an extremely important factor of improved effectiveness and increased efficiency of the projects, undertaken with the support of EU budget. This is why your draftsman has proposed some changes, which go in line with this principle and assure that beneficiaries will not be burdened by unnecessary requirements and formalities.

Finally, your draftsman believes that the European Solidarity Corps will have a great positive influence not only on the young people thus engaged, but also on regional and local communities, and therefore he has undertaken to strengthen the local and regional dimension of this Regulation.






